It was maybe 18 years ago when Don and I came across a movie entitled *Bugsy Malone*. We had heard nothing about this movie so we had no expectations as we sat down to watch it. From the opening song to the grand finale, we were absolutely delighted by the whimsical musical numbers, the story line, and the whole concept of younger actors playing adult roles. Probably the number that caught our imagination the most was a song with the words "you could have been anything you wanted to be." Both Don and I believe that vast amounts of creativity and potential can go untapped in our children and adolescents. Indeed, given the right chances and choices, they can truly become whatever they can dream to be.

Years after watching the movie, we were surprised to find out that the movie was actually based on a play. The downside of this play is that it is surely one of the most technically challenging plays one can stage. As you will see, lots of scene changes, lots of costumes, lots of production numbers, and lots of "splurging" place extreme demands on the set and production crew, as well as on the cast. On the upside, in spite of all these challenges, we consider ourselves to be incredibly lucky as directors. So much raw talent was available in the cast. Countless hours of volunteer set builders, set artists, costumers, choreographers, etc. brought expertise in many areas to help out in the production. So, yes, *Bugsy* has certainly been a challenge; but we feel it is a challenge that has been well met.

Once the show starts we hope you don't even notice any complexities and such, but lose yourself in the play. This is always the goal of a director. So sit back, relax, and enjoy the play!!

We hope you enjoy the new carpet we recently installed in our auditorium with the support of our generous donors and the Mississippi Arts Commission. As you look around, you will notice other things we need to accomplish to improve your theatre experience. The remainder of the 2004 Building Fund Drive will repair the building exterior. This may not be directly visible from your seat, but it will stop the deterioration of the concrete masonry blocks and improve the building's weather tightness. We are in the initial stages of preparing a grant application for the Mississippi Arts Commission 2005 *Building Fund for the Arts* program. For this effort to succeed, we need another \$20,000 in local matching funds in order to obtain \$30,000 in State funds. We hope you will consider helping us.

Barry McCleave — 1948-2004

Barry, *Gold in the Hills* Producer since the early 90s, passed away on September 2nd after a 14-month battle with cancer. He was at home with his wife Earlene and family friends. The funeral was Saturday September 4th at First Christian Church. Memorials may be sent to First Christian Church, 3005 Porters Chapel Road, Vicksburg, MS 39180.

Barry was born on August 31, 1948, grew up in Jackson, and went to MSU. He had a PhD in Electrical Engineering. He worked as a manager trainee at U.S. Steel in Birmingham, Alabama, before joining the Army in 1970. He was a Hawk anti-aircraft missile electronics expert at Redstone Arsenal, Huntsville, Alabama in 1971 when the Army assigned him to the Waterways Experiment Station laboratory in Vicksburg to help design an analog computer model of the Mississippi River. He has been in Vicksburg at the Waterways Experiment Station ever since.

He married Earlene Broadus in November 1973. They eloped and had champagne and twinkies at their celebration party. The champagne was cooled in a small metal "Snoopy" trash can. Their 30th anniversary celebration in 2003 featured champagne, twinkies, and... the trash can.

Barry directed *The Hobbit* in November 2001 and *Paint Your Wagon* in September 2002. Barry's first role was the doctor in *Cheaper by the Dozen*. His other VTG roles included a bungling pirate in *Peter Pan* and "Rodrigo," the bungling assistant pirate in *Babes in Toyland* (Barry claimed "type casting").

He and Earlene directed several Fairy Tale Theatre plays, including *Magic Rail*, *Anne of Green Gables* and *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*. They adapted *The Worst Witch* to stage by special permission of the author, Jill Murphy.

Barry was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer the week before the 2003 summer run of *Gold in the Hills*. In *Gold*, Barry played "Hiram Stanley;" his last time was closing night of the 2003 summer run with his daughter Tiffany as "Nellie." Barry was also a singing waiter in the sing-along; his last time was closing night of the 2004 spring run.

We miss him.
